PGY1 pharmacy residency programs purpose is to build on a Doctor of Pharmacy (Pharm.D.) education and outcomes to contribute to the development of clinical pharmacists responsible for medication-related care of patients with a wide range of conditions, eligible for board certification, and eligible for postgraduate year two (PGY2) pharmacy residency training. The goals, objectives, and evaluation process will be consistent with those established by ASHP for residency training.

QUALIFICATION

The applicant must have a Doctorate of Pharmacy (PharmD) degree from an ACPE accredited pharmacy school (or in process of pursuing accreditation) or a Foreign Pharmacy Graduate Equivalency Certificate (FPGEC) from National Association of Boards of Pharmacy (NABP)

Applicants must also have U.S. citizenship or Green card and be eligible to sit for examination for CA pharmacist licensure
