



Pharmacy Intensive Care Fellowship – Post Graduate Year 2 (PGY2)

Valley Children's offers a year-long, intensive care, second-year residency program called known as a pharmacy fellowship. The program provides training in the focused area of critical care pediatric clinical pharmacy. In addition to gaining a comprehensive understanding of the global aspects of pharmaceutical care in the intensive care unit, the fellowship also emphasizes an intensive research project. For this component, the fellow will work closely with the intensive care physicians to develop and complete a research study suitable for presentation and publication.

Period of Appointment: 12 months

Health Benefits: Full health benefits

Weekend Staffing: Fellows are required to staff the intensive care satellite pharmacy two weekends a month once distribution training is complete.

Responsibilities Include (but not limited to):

- Attend intensive care unit rounds and provide drug information.
- Identify a research project related to intensive care, propose it to the Valley Children's Investigational Review Board, carry out the study and present and publish the study.
- Actively participate in ongoing intensive care research studies as well as any studies initiated during the fellowship.
- Precept pharmacy students and residents rotating through intensive care areas.
- Give presentations to medical and pharmacy staff as well as didactic lectures to pharmacy students and residents.
- Assist in pharmacy and therapeutics activities that relate to intensive care therapeutics.
- Provide distributive support (staffing and dispensing).

Application Requirements:

- All application materials due before the second Monday of January
- At least one year of hospital pharmacy experience is preferred and/or a PGY1 residency
- Must have a California State Board of Pharmacy License (or obtain license within two months of starting fellowship)
- Completed application for employment (available online at valleychildrens.org)
- Letter of Intent
- Three letters of recommendation
- Official school of pharmacy transcripts.
- Be available for interview (January/February)
