PGY1 Pharmacy Residency Program

About the Residency...

The PGY1 Pharmacy Residency Program at Rady Children's Hospital San Diego is a general practice training program established in the year 2000. The program accepts 2 residents annually. The residency centers on the development of knowledge, attitude, and skills needed to provide pharmaceutical care in the specialized area of pediatrics. Each resident will rotate in the areas of General Medicine/Surgery, Pediatric Intensive Care Unit (PICU), Cardiac Intensive Care (CVICU), Neonatal Intensive Care Unit (NICU), Hematology/Oncology, Ambulatory Care, Pharmacy Administration, Distribution, UCSD electives and other chosen electives. The resident will have teaching experiences and earn a teaching certificate as well as gain PALS certification. Each resident will have additional responsibilities including mentoring pharmacy students from UOP and UCSD as well as successfully completing a project suitable for publication, working with renowned researchers from the Pediatric Trials Network. This project will be presented at Western States Seminar.

About the Hospital...

Rady Children's Hospital San Diego is a 551-bed tertiary care, non-profit facility dedicated to the treatment of pediatric patients. It is the only designated pediatric trauma center in the San Diego region. We are affiliated with UCSD Medical Center and are a training center for their medical residents and students. The acute care hospital includes a Level IV Neonatal Intensive Care Unit, Pediatric Intensive Care Unit, Medical, Surgical/Orthopedic/Rehabilitative, and Hematology/Oncology, Children's Adolescent Psychiatry, and Long-term care units and an Emergency Care Center, as well as Licensed beds at Scripps La Jolla, Scripps Encinitas, and Palomar hospitals and pediatric beds at Sharp Grossmont and Palomar hospitals. Multiple clinics are serviced including Asthma, Hematology/Oncology, Dialysis, Gastro-intestinal, Transplant, Cystic Fibrosis, Orthopedic Rehabilitative and Neurology.

Program/Application Requirements...

- Application due December 30, via Phorcas, National Matching Services Code: **236213**
 - Include 3 letters of recommendation, CV, School transcripts, letter of intent
- Employment application (online after interview offered)
- Interviews are usually the last week of January through the first 1-2 weeks in February.
- Must take or be registered for NAPLEX and CPJE licensure exam prior to the 1st day of rotation.
