About CPMC

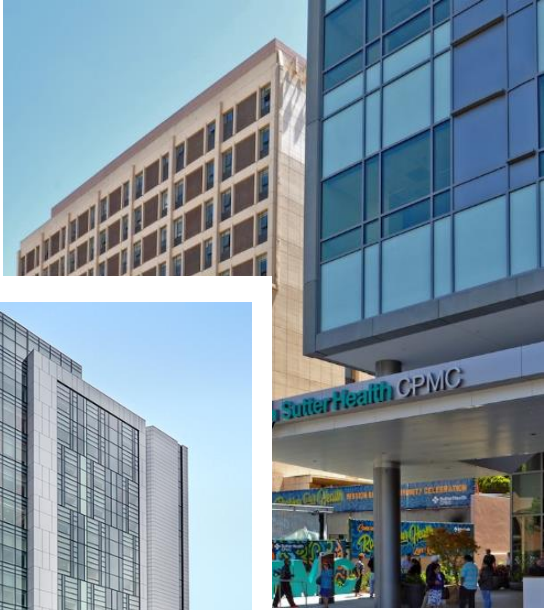
- CPMC is one of the largest not-for-profit medical centers in California

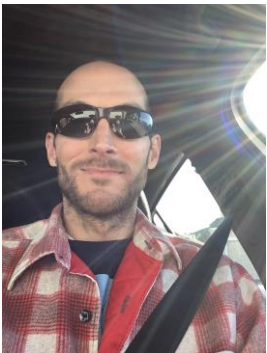
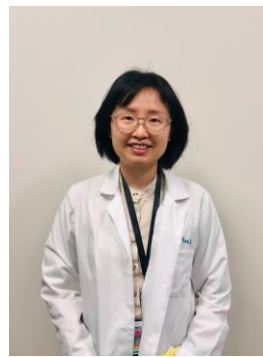
