ABOUT THE MASTER'S DEGREE

The Department of Viticulture & Enology, offers an intensively chemistry-based curriculum in the science of grapegrowing and winemaking. Our program is heavily focused on winemaking, and in viticulture as it regards producing grapes for better wine. The Viticulture & Enology Department offers **two Master's degree programs**, leading to the same Master of Science in Viticulture & Enology: a thesis track (Plan I) and a non-thesis coursework and internship track (Plan II). Applicants need not commit to which track they are applying for at the time of application, and the admission requirements are the same for both tracks. The M.S. degree takes a minimum of 2 years of full-time study to complete. COST OF ATTENDANCE

UC Davis is a public university, the cost of attendance varies slightly each year based on public funding. For 2020-21, the estimated graduate student fees PER QUARTER (three quarters per academic year) are:
In-state fees: \$4,544.67
Health Insurance: \$1,731 (can be waived with proof of equivalent coverage)
Non-Resident Supplemental Tuition: \$5,034 (applies to non-California US students and all International students)
